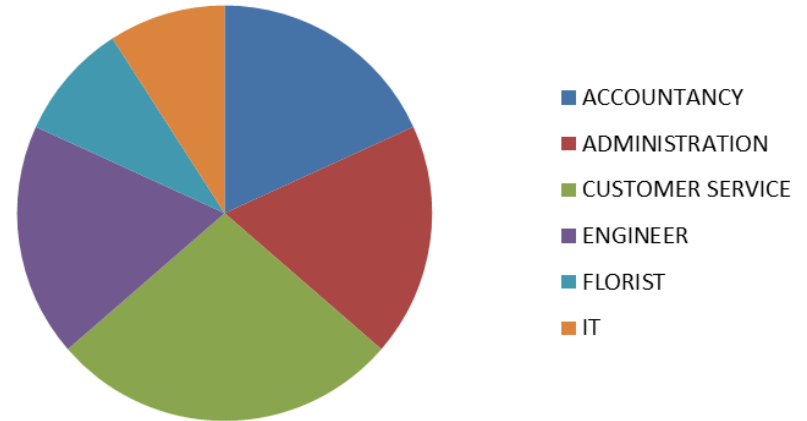

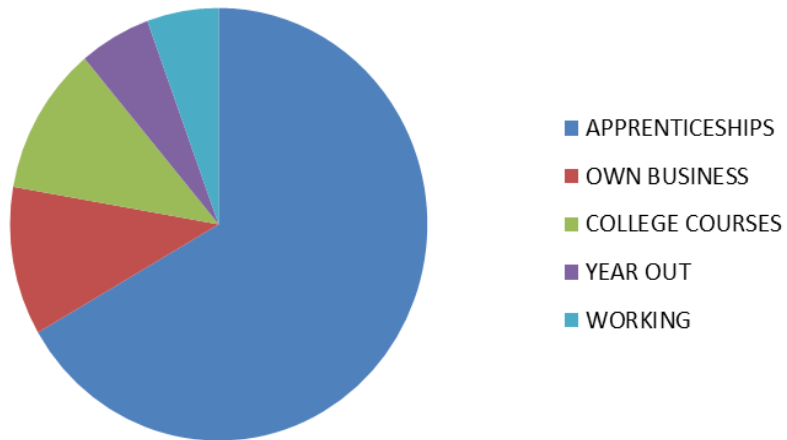

Initial Assessment Week
