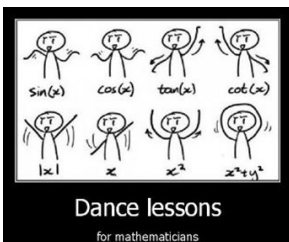
Year 11 Preparation Newsletter - 13 weeks to go - are you ready!!!!

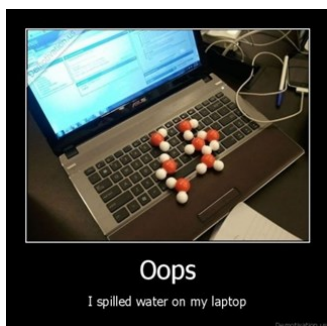
