Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Categories

In September 2014 the headings of School Action, School Action Plus and Statement which were used to categorise children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities, (SEN-D), were replaced:

School Action and School Action Plus now form one single category called **SEN SUPPORT**.

Existing **Statements** will have transferred, where appropriate, to the new **Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP)** by the end of 2018 during the Annual Review Process. We will recognise children and young people as having a Statement until it ceases or becomes an EHCP.

The SEN-D Code of Practice (2015) requires children, where appropriate, to be identified as having SEN-D under one of the four category headings (listed below).

Our School's current data:

Springwood High School has 224 pupils (13%) with SEN-D (accurate at time of reporting) in Years 7 to 13, whose needs have been categorised and fall under the headings in the proportions shown here:

Cognition and Learning	129	out of 224 pupils = 58%
Communication and Interaction	41	out of 224 pupils = 18%
Social, Emotional and Mental Health	73	out of 224 pupils = 33%
Physical and/or Sensory	40	out of 224 pupils = 18%

It should be noted that some pupils have more than one area of need and so are reflected in the figures for more than one category.

13 pupils have been issued with Education, Health and Care Plans and 19 pupils still have a Statement of Special Educational Need (awaiting conversion to EHCPs by Norfolk County Council).
