




REPAYING YOUR STUDENT LOAN

GRADUATES PAY BACK 9% OF WHAT THEY EARN OVER £25,000

IF INCOME FALLS BELOW THE THRESHOLD, PAYMENTS STOP

CURRENT REPAYMENT THRESHOLD IS £25,000 (£2083 a month)

LOAN BALANCE IS CANCELLED AFTER 30 YEARS

Example:

Earning £30,000 you would pay back £37.50 a month

Earning £50,000 you would pay back £187.50 a month
