Our 2022 pass rate was certainly impressive. Students at Springwood continue to aspire to the highest grades, achieving 27% A*/A, 56% A*/B; 82% of students achieved A* - C grades. It was fabulous to be able to welcome back so many students and parents to enjoy a fantastic evening and I am confident all will go on to achieve wonderful things.

KS4 Presentation Evening

For those who may not have heard of Food for Thought, we host free sessions for the public in partnership with the College of West Anglia. Attendees can see how our professional chef cooks nutritious meals on a budget and they can exchange cooking ideas/tips with each other. With the cost of living rising, our sessions could make a huge difference to individuals and families within our local area, but is also a good way of encouraging community involvement and reducing loneliness.

These weekly sessions will be held at the Methodist Church on London Road, PE30 5EJ for 12 weeks. Within our budget, we also have the opportunity to help attendees with transport to and from the venue. Therefore, if people are wanting to come but struggling

Lastly, the venue is fully accessible and child friendly which means everyone within a family can attend the event.
