Exam Reminders

As stated above, students have made an excellent start to their GCSE Exams. There are, however, just a few things to remind them of. Students must be in full school uniform for each exam, including their tie. Students must ensure they are fully equipped for every exam. If students are currently short of any equipment, please remember you can purchase one of our 2 exam specific pencil cases on ParentPay. The pencil case without a calculator costs £1.50 and the pencil case including a calculator costs £10.50.



Finally, please ensure your children are coming into school with their school bag. They need a bag to ensure they have all their revision materials, but also to put their phone in, switched off, during the day. This is more important than ever due to exam guidelines.

If a student takes a phone into an exam, whether it is switched on or off, they can be disqualified and get 0 marks on that paper, and potentially the rest of their papers as well.

To assist students in their preparation for exams after Half- Term, we are running some revisions sessions for core subjects during the students Half Term break. The sessions and dates are below;

<u>Sunday 4th June</u> - Online English Language session. Time to be confirmed on the English Google Classroom. This session is designed for any students who missed the revision on Thursday due to attending the Chemistry session, but all students are welcome to attend.

Key Dates Summary

• End of compulsory attendance – Students' last full day that they are expected to attend school is Friday 16th June. Students will leave site as soon as their Physics exam concludes, unless they are sitting the Geography paper that afternoon, in which case they will remain in school to revise, and leave once the afternoon exam finishes. After this date they will study at home and be expected to attend any remaining GCSE's they are due to sit. The very last exam is Wednesday 21st June 2023 (Polish).

** What is the GCSE contingency day 2023?

A level and GCSE exam contingency day is WEDNESDAY 28TH JUNE 2023. This date has been set by JCQ as a contingency day, should sustained national or local disruption arise during the Summer 2023 examination series.







As stated above, the date of the Prom is 30th June 2023. This year, the theme for the Prom will be James Bond (007). Tickets will go on sale Friday 26th May, and can be purchased through ParentPay. The cost is £20. This year's prom will include a red-carpet welcome, buffet style food, Casino tables, arcade games (Dance Mats and Racing Car Simulators), as well as a DJ. We will be welcoming students to arrive from 6pm, and the evening is due to finish at 11pm. We look forward to seeing all our students looking smart and glamorous!

Leaver Assembly and BBQ

On Monday the 26th of June we will be inviting Year 11 Students back into school at 10am for a leaver's assembly and BBQ. Students will then leave the school site again at 12pm. There is a small charge of £2 per student for the BBQ which can be paid via ParentPay. This will also be available to pay from Friday the 26th May. If your child is in receipt of free school meals then the £2 will be covered by the school.





The leaver's assembly and BBQ will be the only opportunity for shirt signing. We expect students to attend the assembly in their full school uniform, but there will be opportunity for shirt signing to take place. This must not be done on any other day, including the 16th of June due to exams still taking place.
