- 50 students were registered as Pupil Premium.
- 6 students were identified as 'Outliers', having less than 50% attendance over the school year.
- The 6 students made up **12%** of the Pupil Premium cohort.

Headline Figures

- The Pupil Premium gap was **-0.85** at the end of the academic year.
- When the 6 Outliers were removed, the gap reduced to **0.63**, a reduction of **26%** in the gap.
- The worst 8 PP scores show a similar pattern, being accountable for **48%** of our Pupil Premium gap, with the gap reducing to **-0.46**
- The Attendance Outliers made up **12%** of our PP Cohort but **35%** of our gap
- The 8 biggest underachieving PP students made up **16%** of our PP cohort but **48%** of our gap

Impact Statements

Summer School – The Summer School was attended by 75 students from across the trust. 50% of the Year 11 PP cohort attended

Saturday School – Huge impact for PP students as shown above. 55% of PP students attended from Sept to May

Exceptional Data Analysis – The PP attainment gap almost halves when only 8 students are removed. The raw score does not show the progress of 85% of our PP students

Destinations – 36% of PP students stayed on into the Sixth Form. 43% of non PP students stayed on into Sixth Form. A small gap.

Extra-Curricular activities and trips – All PP students attend trips such as Sailing, visits to the beach and Sandringham house, with some students accessing a support fund to attend Disneyland, Ecuador and New York

Extra-Curricular Clubs – Breakfast and Homework Clubs available daily and target PP students.

Strength and Relationships with Families – PP Parent attendance at Progress Evenings is continuing to increase. Gaps are now minimal, and in some year groups none existent with Non PP Parent Attendance.
