

Year 9

We begin an in depth study of Christianity and Hinduism, ready for the GCSE course in Year 10. By the end of Year 9 we have covered about 50% of the GCSE material.

Year 10

Having laid the groundwork with our studies of Christianity and Hinduism, religions, in Year 10 we start looking at the Themes, moral and ethical issues. What do Christians say? What do Hindus say? What do you think?



Theme B Religion and Life

When does life start – and does an abortion end a life? When does life end – and should euthanasia be permitted? How did the Universe originate, and how should humans treat animals?

Theme A Relationships and Families

Marriage? Cohabitation? Same sex relationships? Divorce? We look at the different types of families – what is the difference between an extended and a nuclear family? What about women? Are they treated with equality in the family, and within religion?



Theme F: Religion Human Rights and Social Justice

What are human rights? What are human responsibilities? What is exploitation? What issues are raised by wealth and poverty? We consider issues and people related to prejudice and to discrimination.



Year 11

We complete our final Theme, and then we revisit the content of Hinduism and Christianity and practice exam technique.

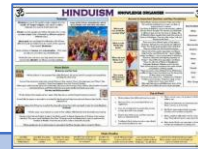


Theme D: Religion, peace and conflict

What is Just War? What is pacifism? These are the two key questions for us to consider. We also look at the ideas of forgiveness and reconciliation, contrasting such responses with violence and terrorism, and we consider issues raised by weapons of mass destruction.
