#### **Unit 3: Creative Process GLH 90:**

##### **Summer Theme One - Compulsory:**

##### **Task One Instructions:**

The Creative Process is a Year 13 BTEC unit (which we have already started), this is an exciting opportunity where you are a fashion designer; creating and designing a fashion collection for the Summer Fashion Show. As a designer you will need to be inspired and have a starting point for new and original ideas for your fashion collection. *The following tasks will be evidence for unit 3: which will feed into your BTEC (Equivalent to one A Level) portfolio.*

##### **Fashion Design Illustrations Task One:**

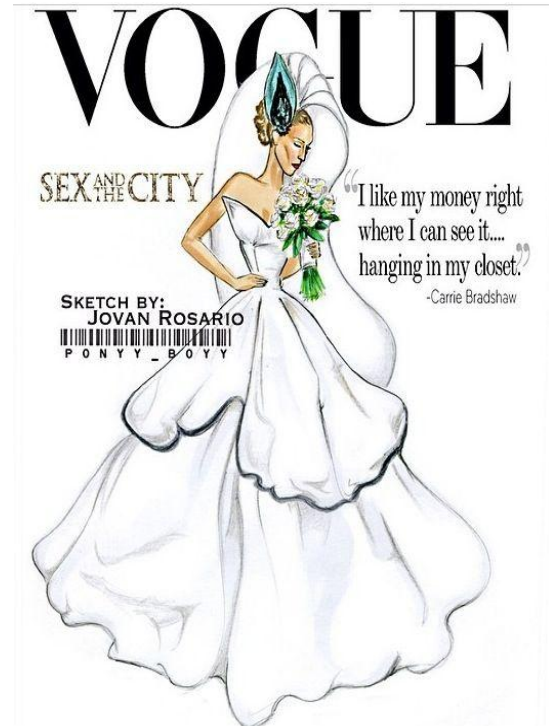
- **Design 3** Fashion Illustrations inspired by the iconic fashion designer **Vivienne Westwood**.
- Be creative, consider colour, style, patterns, fabrics and embellishments – inspired by one or more of the famous fashion designers' themes.
- Front view and back view of the fashion illustration designs.
- Consider the length of the clothing, pockets, zips etc. Provide close-up drawings of design features.
- Draw and use a creative, stylish font for the title page: **Vivienne Westwood Fashion Designs**.
- Annotate the designs, explaining key features about your ideas. Include fabric swatches.

**Suggested Processes / Techniques:** We would like to challenge you to explore a broad range of media when adding colour to your designs, which might include:

- Black outline designs to make them stand-out
- Tonal shading with colouring pencils / pens
- Mark making
- Collage: tear / rip / distress / paper / fabric
- Watercolours / paints

Use this opportunity to try out new and inventive ways of capturing your theme; have some fun!

We would like to challenge you to explore and develop your **practical skills** in Textiles.

### Task Two Instructions:

#### Hand Embroidery Sample Task Two (Optional):

- Create a **hand embroidery sample** using a variety of stitches such as running stitch, backstitch, French knots, etc. Inspired by one of Vivienne Westwood's fashion designs.

- Equipment: sewing needles, embroidery threads, embroidery hoops (optional), scrap material to sew onto (cotton, felt, old clothes, pillow cases, etc.).

### Key Notes for drawing illustration of the garment:

Make sure the illustration of the female/male form is in proportion!

Buy a sketchbook- A3 (preferably A3) with good quality paper.
