What should I do if my child is unwell? – If your child is unwell, please call the Year 11 Office on 01553 778099 or email classof2026@springwoodhighschool.co.uk before 8.00am and give the specific reasons and symptoms of the illness. You will need to contact the office EVERY DAY that your child is off. The information you give will be recorded on our official register.

Leave of Absence – There may be exceptional circumstances where you need to request a leave of absence for your child. You will need to submit a “Leave of Absence Form.” These can be found on the school website, or we have a paper copy in the office. This form needs handing into the Year 10 office. You will then receive a phone call, email or SIMS message stating if your request has been granted or denied.

Attendance Message

Wren, our attendance dog, is currently enjoying the start of the new school year, welcoming back familiar faces along with the new year 7s and 12s. Thank you for your continued support with good attendance for your child's attendance has continued to be above national figures since the start of the term.

We have had a number of holidays taken during this school year already. We are not allowed to authorise any holidays taken during term time. If your child does not arrive back on the planned day after a holiday we will be required to carry out a welfare check, and this will be completed in person or via an online video call, as we have to see the child. If your child is ill following a holiday we may well require medical evidence. The local authority will issue fixed penalty notices for a total of more than 4 and a half days of any unauthorised absence within a 10-school week period.

We are once again approaching the cold season. Please check out the NHS, <https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/>, for when you should and shouldn't send your child to school - for most minor ailments they should be in. Please liaise with your child's year office if they are suffering a bit but well enough to attend so that we can be aware of them during the day. If you do feel that your child is too unwell, could you please let the year team know the details, not just “they are unwell”. As above, any prolonged absence will require us to complete a home visit.

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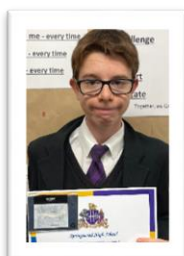

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Uniform Reminder

At Springwood High School we are very proud of our students who are wonderfully presented and wear our school uniform with pride. This is extremely important to build a school identity amongst the pupils and the wider community. We would like to remind all parents that the school uniform policy can be found on our website. We also would like to draw attention to the following;

- The only jewellery students are permitted to wear is **one** pair of studded earrings and a wrist watch.
- False nails must not be worn.
- Any nose stud must be a clear plastic retainer
- Students are not permitted to wear leggings.
- Please check the policy for acceptable footwear - and note that branded black shoes (Nike Airforce, Adidas etc) are not permitted.
- Blazers must be worn at all times.

With the change in season students are encouraged to bring a coat to school, this must be plain in colour and fit over the school blazer. Hoodies are not acceptable.

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Astronomy GCSE



These students passed the so-called hard course with flying colours, especially Grace Dickson who got a 9, proving that with the right amount of hard work and motivation goals are definitely achievable, with the sky as the limit.

Astronomy lays out a solid foundation for the students who wish to do physics at a higher level, astrophysics or those who are just genuinely interested in the night sky or the wonders of outer space. Jack Higgins says "taking this qualification has been interesting and has motivated me to get into Astrophysics...". One can also take it as a hobby! However, it is true that this qualification is quite demanding but it is also extremely rewarding in terms of future employability or university qualifications. Cherry Yu, who aspires to do A Level Physics says that "...the course is definitely amazing in every way and I would definitely recommend it to younger students". Even the long-time experienced physicist Dr Angus, who was their teacher and other relevant staff members were not only impressed with the results, but most of all, the dedication demonstrated by the students.

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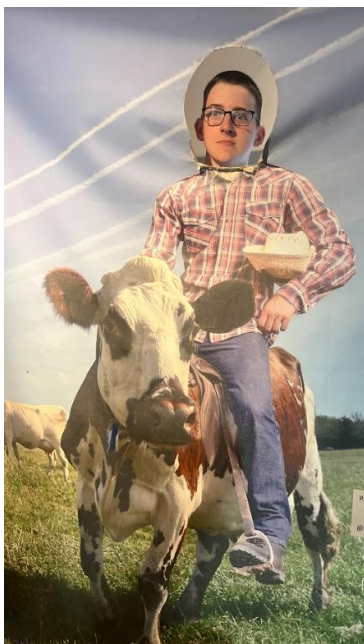

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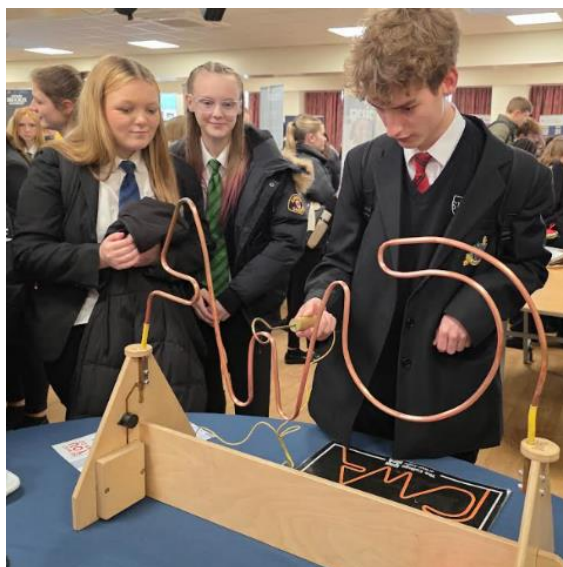
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Careers Fair

Overall, it was a fantastic opportunity for our students to explore what's on offer in our local area and to start thinking about their next steps.



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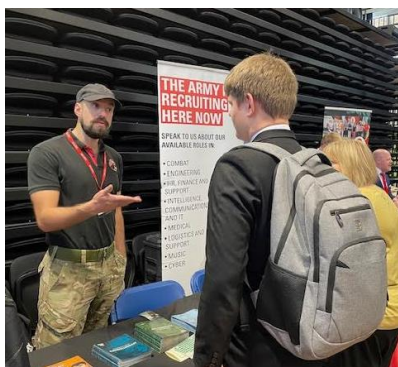

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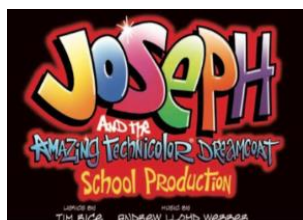


Extracurricular at Springwood High School

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Our English Curriculum – We learn about key concepts that underpin English as an academic subject, reading and exploring a range of texts that show these ideas in practice. We read novels, extracts from novels, short stories, poems, plays, and a range of non-fiction, covering lots of different genres, historical periods, forms, and authors. As we move through KS3, we will see how all of these concepts connect with another. We look at excellent models of writing as well to help us produce our own stories and non-fiction pieces of writing.

Y7 Term 1: Story & Context

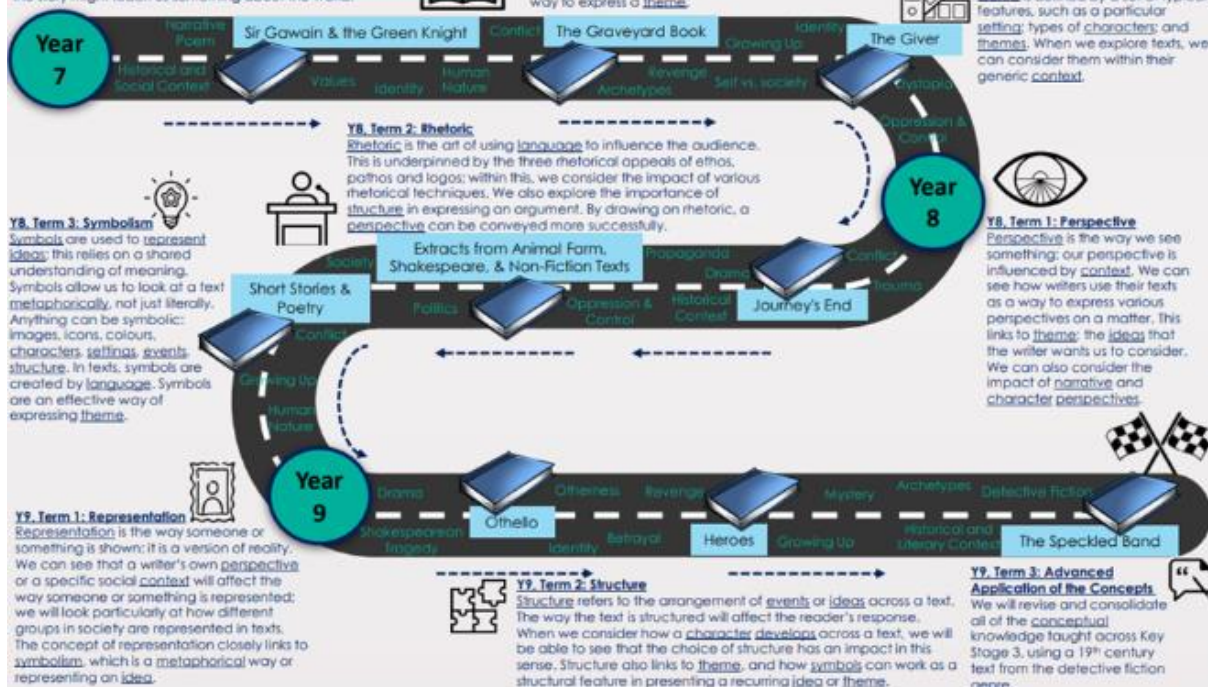
Stories are created by writers: they are constructed. Writers are influenced by lots of things, e.g. society, religion, personal experience, other stories. Even when a story is clearly fictitious, we can see how it reflects elements of the real world and human nature. Knowing the context—background—to a story helps to improve our understanding of the story itself. Equally, the story might teach us something about the world.

Y7 Term 2: Characterisation

Characters are deliberately and consciously constructed by the writer, and are developed across a story. The characterisation choices a writer makes will influence the way the reader responds to that character. Characters play a particular role in the story, and can be used as a way to express a theme.

Y7 Term 3: Genre & Theme

Genre is defined by a set of typical features, such as a particular setting: types of characters; and themes. When we explore texts, we can consider them within their generic context.
