

Technology

In Design & Technology this term, Year 7 students have been developing their designing and making skills through an exciting practical project: creating a bookend inspired by the nature-themed designs of William Morris. Students explored the work of William Morris, including his use of natural forms, repeating patterns and detailed decorative style. They then used this research to inform their own designs, adapting natural shapes and motifs into a practical product.

Throughout the project, pupils have been learning how to:

- Generate and develop design ideas inspired by an artist or movement
 - Work accurately and safely
- Use hand tools and workshop equipment correctly
- Apply finishing techniques to decorate their work

The final bookends demonstrate a strong link between art, design and practical making, and students should be proud of the creativity and craftsmanship they have shown.

Extracurricular at Springwood High School



Uniform Reminder

At Springwood High School we are very proud of our students who are wonderfully presented and wear our school uniform with pride. This is extremely important to build a school identity amongst the pupils and the wider community. We would like to remind all parents that the school uniform policy can be found on our website. We also would like to draw attention to the following;

- The only jewellery students are permitted to wear is **one** pair of studded earrings and a wrist watch.
- False nails must not be worn.
- Any nose stud must be a clear plastic retainer
- Students are not permitted to wear leggings.
- Please check the policy for acceptable footwear - and note that branded black shoes (Nike Airforce, Adidas etc) are not permitted.
- Hair must be a natural colour.
- Blazers must be worn at all times.

With the change in season students are encouraged to bring a coat to school, this must be plain in colour and fit over the school blazer. Hoodies are not acceptable.
