In this module students learn about how to work independently and structure their own project working individually with teacher support. Students complete their initial planning producing mood boards and sider diagrams, statements of intent, planning and research for their forthcoming project. Students will be expected to work independently as well as feeding back using peer/ 1:1/ group assessment.
