Attendance Information

What should I do if my child is unwell? – If your child is unwell, please call the Year 9 Office on 01553 778099 or email classof2026@springwoodhighschool.co.uk before 8.00am and give the specific reasons and symptoms of the illness. You will need to contact the office EVERY DAY that your child is off. The information you give will be recorded on our official register.

Leave of Absence – There may be exceptional circumstances where you need to request a leave of absence for your child. You will need to submit a "Leave of Absence Form." These can be found on the school website or we have a paper copy in the office. This form needs handing into the Year 9 office. You will then receive a phone call, email or SIMS message stating if your request has been granted or denied.

Attendance Message

Once again, thank you for your continued support with keeping attendance of your child high at the school. Attending school is not only positive in terms of getting the best results possible in terms of exams, and therefore future chances in employment, but also in terms of social and mental health. There is support available, including JustOneNorfolk to help support students who suffer from mental health issues.

We know that some students do struggle with attending school and we thank you for your continued close working partnership with the pastoral and attendance teams at the school. The attendance team can support with a range of attendance interventions for a variety of different cases, and we are happy to arrange meetings as soon as issues arise.

Unfortunately these interventions are not always successful, or there is an absence for a term time holiday. In both of these cases the absences will be referred to Norfolk County Council, in line with the government guidance.

From August this year, a new Attendance Framework has been introduced that all schools and local authorities must adhere to, to ensure consistency across the country. Fines will now also be issued when a child has missed 10 or more sessions (5 days) across a rolling period of 10 school weeks for unauthorised absences. Fines have increased, per parent, per child, to £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days. If there is a second fine for the same child within a period of 3 years then the fine will automatically be £160. There is also no longer a code for authorising holidays and so any holiday will be coded as unauthorised absence.

As stated, we will have to work within the new framework starting from September 2024, where the expectations from the government is that all children should attend school full time. If you wish to read the updated guidance, please find the link here:




