Ramble across Roydon Common



On 28 June, a select band of Springwood High School pupils had the opportunity to escape the classroom for a precious couple of hours and visit nearby Roydon Common. It was an all-too short introduction to this Norfolk Wildlife Trust reserve and some of its outstanding flora and fauna. Agnieszka Munns, lead of the school's environmental committee, guided Babs, Lilly, Ben and Alice to the common and, armed with field guides, binoculars and a telescope, set out to make some interesting and engaging connections between the pupils and their surrounding world. Bird life was obliging: yellowhammers, linnets, skylarks and stonechats all posed or displayed in the sunshine, allowing everyone to practise identifying them and finding them in the guides. Red kites were distinguished from common buzzards, and a garden warbler was identified singing on 'Merlin', bringing the modern app to the natural world in an innovative and exciting manner. Insect life was less conspicuous: while only one fly-by dragonfly species was spotted, three sadly unidentified beetle species were examined. Any of the adders which can be encountered in thicker, heathery spots were, of course, avoided by staying to the marked footpaths. Pupils were also introduced to the ecology of the area: focussing on its sandy soil and geographical features, which showed how it had, in the distant past, formed part of the coastline. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to visit this fragment of a disappearing world, seeing birds that are increasingly rare and threatened, and appreciating the value of a place that needs to be protected and treasured if it is to continue to survive for its 15 species of dragonfly, 30 species of butterfly, 450 species of moth and many rare plants.

Attendance Information

What should I do if my child is unwell? —If your child is unwell, please call the Year 7 Office on 01553 778090 or email <u>classof2027@springwoodhighschool.co.uk</u> before 8.00am and give specific reasons and symptoms of the illness. You will need to contact the office EVERY DAY that your child is off. The information you give will be recorded on our official register.

Leave of Absence—There may be exceptional circumstances where you need to request a leave of absence for your child. You will need to submit a 'Leave of Absence Form'. These can be found on the school website or we have a paper copy in the office. This form needs handing in to the Year 7 Office. You will then receive a phone call, email or SIMS message stating if your request has been granted or denied.

Attendance Information

Expected attendance at Springwood High School is 100% and regular attendance is a minimum of 96%; this is equivalent to students attending for 182 of the 190 days possible in a school year.

Appendix 4: Attendance Policy Quick Guide for Parents

Attendance Policy Quick Guide for Parents

We expect pupils to attend school for 100% of the academic year.

You can support your child to have excellent attendance by taking these steps:

- Ensure your child arrives on time for school every day and is ready to learn. Arriving after registration is recorded as an unauthorised absence. Pupils must be in school by 8:45 am.
- Avoid taking holidays during term time.
- If your child appears to be only slightly ill, send them in to school. We have staff who will contact you if their condition deteriorates.
- Book any medical appointments outside of school hours. If this is unavoidable, please book for as late in the afternoon as possible and inform the school of appointments in advance.
- Supply a copy of the appointment card or hospital letter if your child has an appointment during school hours.

If your child becomes reluctant to go to school or you need help, please contact the school immediately; we are more likely to be able to work together to solve any problems if we act early.
