## **Careers and Post 16**

#### **Mock Trials Competition**

A handful of Year 11 students, along with Year 12's recently took part in the mock trials competition. Students were given two specially written cases so they can try the law against their peers in the courthouse. This competition has given students a chance to build on skills, such as critical analysis, public speaking and teamwork.

#### 'Respected' Athlete convicted for the possession of performance enhancing drugs.

Professional athlete, Vim Speed, received a guilty verdict for the possession of Class B drugs under the Misuse of Drugs Act of 1971.

On the 1st of September, Mr Speed was met with security at the entrance of the Velodrome Arena, where he was revealed to have had a Class B drug. Speed claimed these drugs were owned by his former teammate: Ash Morgan; and was reportedly going to 'hand them in to the authorities'.

The prosecution barristers claimed Vim Speed was in possession of these Performance Enhancing Drugs out of desperation due to his 'disadvantaged background'. Conversely, Speed claims he discovered the drugs at the athlete's shared accommodation in Ash Morgan's locker and would never jeopardise his career; Vim described it as a 'suspicious' package wrapped in cling film.

The security guard reported that Speed never mentioned the police and questioned his intent with the drugs. However, PC Mayflower outlined that they carried out a drug test on the athlete, Vim Speed, and received negative results.

In response Ash Morgan, who was described as Speed's rival at the time, shared that he had no evidence to accuse Speed of using the drugs, only 'suspicions'.

The prosecution used their rivalry to claim that Vim used this as a perfect motive to plant the Class B drug. Morgan was reportedly a part of the Anti Drug Committee and claimed he is extremely against PED's. However, Morgan is known to have had a reputation for alcohol abuse.

After both, Prosecution and Defence, concluded the trial with their closing statements the Judge allowed five minutes for the Jury to decide Vim Speed's verdict. As a result, the Jury revealed that Speed was guilty of the possession of Class B Performance Enhancing Drugs.







#### **STEM Christmas Lectures**



We were delighted to again have students attend our annual STEM Christmas lecture to hear about the diverse range of careers and opportunities in STEM. This year we were very fortunate to have speakers in the fields of ecology and chemical engineering. We would like to give a massive thank you to Martin Tooley and Tom Parks for joining us. The lectures were for all students from Yr7-Yr13 and their parents. With nearly 100 people in attendance it was a wonderful evening.

"I had the great opportunity of attending the STEM lectures on the 3rd December. The two lecturers had established careers in chemical engineering and conservation. Both gave incredibly in-depth talks about their respective fields. Each one of their topics had its feet in the GCSE and A-level courses, this allowed a great introduction to these sciences and careers available to the vast amount of students who attended." - Jaxon W
