

## **Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Categories**

Students who have been identified as having a Special Educational Need have provision made for them through either an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) or SEN Support. The SEN-D Code of Practice (2015) requires children, where appropriate, to be identified as having SEN-D under one of the following four category headings:

Cognition and Learning	Communication and Interaction
Social, Emotional and Mental Health	Physical and/or Sensory

## Our School's current data:

Springwood High School has 205 pupils (12%) with SEN-D (accurate at time of reporting) in Years 7 to 13. Within Years 7 to 11 there are 189 pupils with SEN-D, making 14% of these respective year groups. The students' needs have been categorised and fall under the headings in the proportions shown here:

Category of need	Area of need as a % of those pupils with SEN-D in Years 7-11	Area of need as a% of those pupils with SEN-D, including those in Years 12 and 13
Cognition and Learning	67%	61%
Communication and Interaction	21%	19%
Social, Emotional and Mental Health	42%	39%
Physical and/or Sensory	16%	15%

It should be noted that some pupils have more than one area of need and so are reflected in the figures for more than one category.

30 pupils have been issued with Education, Health and Care Plans and 175 pupils are recognised under SEN Support.
