## **Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Categories**

Students who have been identified as having a Special Educational Need, have provision made for them through either an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) or SEN Support. The SEN-D Code of Practice (2015) requires children, where appropriate, to be identified as having SEN-D under one of the following four Broad Areas of Need:

Cognition and Learning	Communication and Interaction
Social, Emotional and Mental Health	Physical and/or Sensory

## **Our School's current data:**

Springwood High School has 199 pupils (11%) with SEN-D (accurate at time of reporting) in Years 7 to 13. Within Years 7 to 11 there are 186 pupils with SEN-D, making 13% of these respective year groups. These percentages remain unchanged from the previous year. The students' Primary Needs have been categorised and fall under the headings in the proportions shown here:

25 pupils have been issued with Education, Health and Care Plans and 186 pupils are recognised under SEN Support.
