This term we have launched the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award with my year group and set each tutor group the target of outperforming the national average for completed Bronze awards. Thank you for your support with this and for returning your signed consent forms. The D of E programme is split into four areas to be completed, Skill, Volunteering, Physical and an Expedition. The cost of participation is usually £130, but this has been reduced to £30 during the Covid outbreak and the Expedition requirement removed. The Head has kindly agreed to pay this fee for every child in Year 9 and I have introduced a first aid course into tutor time that once completed will meet the Skills part of the


award. Students can complete the Volunteering and Physical sections in school or at home to gain a nationally recognised award. We will provide further guidance on this in later newsletters.

As part of our programme of encouraging students to participate in more extra-curricular activities, we are awarding Key Stage Three Champions Certificates and Role Model badges to students who are involved in positive activities outside of school. To be nominated please speak to your form tutor and tell him or her what you do! September's winners in Year 9 are;

Sammi Barlow – A talented showjumper who has participated in many competitions and represented Norfolk and England. Recently Sammi has been to Bolesworth Castle to jump in the National Championships and represented Norfolk at the Stoneleigh Estate in Coventry.

Ben Cross - Ben has been making PPE equipment with his family for the NHS since lockdown began. This included making masks and scrubs – a fantastic demonstration of community spirit. Both of you will be presented your certificate and badge by Mr Johnson.

Just before lockdown we were able to praise 8F1 and Mr Childs for being in the lead in our Form Competition. Well done everyone and 8F1, your form name has been added to our Form Competition trophy! This is something that I established right back at the beginning of Year 7 to encourage inter form rivalry and promote the very best characteristics in our students. They are awarded points for 100% attendance, 95%+ attendance, not being late to lessons, achievement points etc. However they also have points deducted for any behaviour points, missed homework or lack of equipment and PE kit. Each student is given a score and this is then averaged by the number of students in each form. Good forms support and challenge each other to consistently do well over each term. The latest results for the first half-term of Year 9 are below!



This year at Springwood we have introduced a new knowledge rich curriculum and produced termly knowledge organisers for each Key Stage Three year groups. This will replace the usual homework that your child is set and contains the essential information that a student needs to know to succeed each term. Monthly quizzes will be set by me and the scores kept by form tutors to monitor progress. Can you please encourage your child to learn the contents of these books at home? Spare copies can be obtained from form tutors, the year office or online via the school website.





Please can you check with your child that they can access their school email account and have accepted their subject requests so we can continue lessons online should we need too? Many subjects are now using Google Classrooms to share resources, PowerPoints from lessons and additional support in an effort to encourage pupils to become familiar with this system before it is needed in earnest. Cambridge University already use this as their sole way of communicating with students and I'd like to take this opportunity to praise The Brilliant Club students who have joined me and Cambridge University every Thursday afternoon after school online to complete their first research project on medicine. Much of the content we have already covered so far this year is at a GCSE level; well-done guys!
