## **Futures Day Back Bigger and Better**

On 21st October we held our annual Futures Event to inspire students to consider career and education pathways they might not have considered before. The event was specifically aimed at 14-18-year-old students who are making important decisions about their post-16 and post-18 choices:

- For students in Year 10 the event was an ideal opportunity for them to be inspired by new careers and training and employment opportunities from studying at the University Technical College in Norwich to exploring careers at big name employers such as Mars, Aviva and the Army
- Students in Year 11 were being encouraged to make decisions about their post-16 options including applications to sixth form or FE colleges and/or apprenticeships
- Students in Sixth Form considered HE or higher-level apprenticeships post-18

Almost 1,000 students visited the Careers Fair which was divided into the Employment Zone and the Education Zone. We were delighted to welcome back a wide range of employers from the local area including The Borough Council of King's Lynn and West Norfolk, QEH, Lovell, BAE Systems, Mapus-Smith and Lemmon and Hayes and Storr. Uniformed Services are also well represented with Norfolk Police and the Army in attendance.









Students completed Scavenger Hunt activities which encouraged them to engage with exhibitors and ask them questions about the courses or career paths available to them.

Heads of Year for different age groups also put together an itinerary of tailored careers activities before students attend the Careers Fair. These involve employers and education providers (including FE colleges and universities) delivering workshops to help students to make informed decisions about their next steps.

Year 10s heard from the College of West Anglia, Springwood Sixth Form and the Apprenticeship Service about the choices they have after GCSEs.

Year 11s completed the Help

You Choose application process for post-16 choices and developed their employability skills by focusing on building confidence and resilience.

Year 12s found out about the benefits of securing work experience and how to develop employability skills.

Year 13s had mock interviews with Dodman Ltd and Cranswick Foods and heard about applying for an apprenticeship from Springwood Alumni Ruby Goodchild who is completing her apprenticeship with Maxey Grounds.




We had a fantastic day at the **Springwood Sixth Form** Careers Day yesterday - our second year attending!
