**Focus areas:** We will soon have covered all course topics and will begin revision. Your priorities at home should be:

- Complete revision exercises on ActiveLearn.
- General conversation– Make sure the answers in your speaking booklet are complete for the modules we have covered and start practising the answers you have already prepared. Make sure your answers show a range of tenses.
- Picture task – revise key vocab for describing a photo. Foundation students should also practise written photo descriptions.
- Role play – revise question words and common language needed for transactions (booking/buying things).
- Extended writing – practise writing on different topics, referring to past, present and future in each. 90 words+
- Revise key grammar, especially tenses. Ensure you can refer to the past, present and future using a variety of different tenses. Ensure you are confident giving opinions and talking about others.
- Produce revision resources (mindmaps/flashcards etc. for each topic, to help you revise). Go back through your Y9 and 10 work to help you with this.
- Revise vocab daily using your vocab books and suggested websites (see below).
- Listen to authentic sources (i.e. Spanish radio/subtitled films and TV programmes - there are several on Netflix at the moment)
- Read from authentic sources (blogs, news articles, a short book in Spanish) You could also practise your translation skills using these written sources.
