7 steps to success



1.

Start planning your revision early.



- If you haven't already, purchase the revision guide from the school shop.
- **Aim to do 15-20min of revision every day.** This is often more effective than trying to do several hours in one go less often.

2.

Practice, practice, practice.



- Being a relatively new specification, there is a lack of practice exam papers. However, a **workbook** of practice questions is available from the school shop.

3.

Use SENECA.

- A **free** mobile, tablet and web app with practice questions is available for online.
- Details can be found at <https://www.senecalearning.com/>
- All students have been given a log in.

4.

Use the support available: after school revision/revision calendar.

- Support for students is offered after school **every Tuesday from 3:30pm – 4:30pm in S4.**

5.

Know your maths skills.

- Despite being a Geography exam, the following numerical skills may be examined: **calculating the median, mean, range, quartiles and inter-quartile range, mode and modal class.**

6.

Use data and evidence in your answer.

- If a question is based around a resource such as an image, diagram, table of data or map, you must make **direct reference to it in your answer.**
- Failure to refer to the resource will severely limit the marks you can get.

7.

Only answer the units you've been taught.

- Schools are not required to teach all units examined in the exam.
- Read each section of the exam carefully and only answer the units you've been taught!
