50 things you should know:

## Set work 1 – Bach: Brandenburg Concerto No. 5 in D major (3<sup>rd</sup> Movement)

- 1. Composed in the **BAROQUE** period.
- 2. The composition is an example of a **CONCERTO GROSSO**.
- 3. Solo instruments (Flute, violin and Harpsichord) are the **CONCERTINO**
- 4. The accompaniment instruments (a small chamber orchestra) is the RIPIENO
- 5. Bass and keyboard accompaniment is known as the BASSO CONTINUO
- **6.** Harmony is **DIATONIC**
- 7. Dynamic changes are known as TERRACED DYNAMICS
- 8. Melody uses much ornamentation such as trills and appoggiaturas.

#### Set Work 2 - Beethoven:Piano Sonata No. 8 in C minor Op. 13, 'Pathetique' (1st mvt)

- 9. Published in 1799 the late **CLASSICAL** period.
- 10. The movement is in SONATA FORM
- 11. Sonata form is made up of 3 main sections: **EXPOSITION, DEVELOPMENT, RECAPITULATION**.
- 12. The movement uses a very wide 5 octave range.
- 13. The movement starts with a **SLOW INTRODUCTION**
- 14. 2<sup>nd</sup> subject of the exposition modulates to the unexpected key of **E flat minor**.
- 15. Texture is **HOMOPHONIC**
- 16. There is much detailed and extreme dynamic contrast including crescendos and diminuendos.

#### Set work 3 - Purcell: Music for a While

- 17. Written in the mid **BAROQUE** period
- 18. This song was written as **INCIDENTAL MUSIC** to be performed as part of a play.
- 19. Composed for just solo voice and continuo.
- 20. Harmonies are realized from a **FIGURED BASS**.
- 21. The structure is a **GROUND BASS**, repeated 12 times.
- 22. There is **TERNARY FORM** as well as there is a B section in the middle that modulates.
- 23. **WORD PAINTING** is used regularly
- 24. Word setting is mainly SYLLABIC, but occasionally uses a MELISMA (wond'ring)

#### Set work 4 – 'Killer Queen' (from the Queen album Sheer Heart Attack)

- 25. Written in 1974
- 26. All vocal lead and backing are **OVERDUBBED** and performed by Freddie Mercury
- 27. There is an extremely wide **vocal range** of two octaves and a third.
- 28. Much use of studio technology including a **PHASE SHIFTER** ('laser beam')
- 29. Guitars use DISTORTION and WAH WAH
- 30. There is a basic **VERSE AND CHORUS** form with instrumental sections added.
- 31. Melody is mainly moves in step but there are some much larger leaps as well
- 32. Key is **E flat major**, but often ambiguous and some sections start in **C minor** or B flat **major**

#### Set work 5 – Steven Schwartz: 'Defying Gravity' (from the musical Wicked)

- 33. Based upon the story of **The Wizard of Oz**
- 34. This song is the finale number in Act 1
- 35. The song is scored to be accompanied by a large pit orchestra.
- 36. The score in the anthology is a reduction known as a SHORT SCORE
- 37. There is a **LEITMOTIF** which quotes the first 7 pitches of 'Somewhere Over the Rainbow'
- 38. There is much rhythmic **SYNCOPATION**
- 39. There is a **VERSE CHORUS** structure with some variations
- 40. Word setting is almost entirely SYLLABIC

# Set work 6 – John Williams: 'Main Title/'Rebel Blockade Runner' (from Star Wars:Episode IV – A New Hope)

- 41. Scored for a full **SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA** of nearly 90 players
- 42. Structure dictated by visual images, but starts with a FANFARE, then an ABA Ternary structure
- 43. Uses **QUATAL** harmonies
- 44. First half in B flat major, second half far more DISSONANT and almost ATONAL at times.
- 45. Intervals of a 4th and a 7th feature heavily in melodies.
- 46. John Williams makes much use of LEITMOTIFS

#### Set wok 7 - Afro Celt Sound System: 'Release' (from the album Volume 2: Release)

- 47. Album released in 1999
- 48. Uses a combination of African, Celtic and Western instruments
- 49. Kora, Djembe, Talking Drum (African)
- 50. Uilleann Pipes, Fiddle, Accordian, Bodhran, Hurdy-Gurdy (Celtic)
- 51. Drum Kit, Synthesisers, Electric Piano, Digital Effects (western)
- 52. Tonality is MODAL
- 53. Texture is LAYERED
- 54. Melodies are mostly **PENTATONIC**

### Set Work 8 – 'Samba Em Preludio', performed by Esperanza Spalding (from the album Esperanzo)

- 55. The song is a BOSSA NOVA
- 56. Written in 1962
- 57. Sung by a female voice with a **LOW TESSITURA**
- 58. Mostly accompanied by an ACOUSTIC BASS GUITAR
- 59. Is in the key of **B minor** with frequent **CHROMATIC** notes.
- 60. CHORD EXTENSIONS (7ths, 9ths 11ths and 13ths) are used.
