A trip has been arranged for Year 13 English students to visit the Fitzwilliam Museum in Cambridge on Thursday 10th March 2016.

For the first part of the day, students will take part in the Cambridge University Museum's 'Visionaries and Romantics' session. This gallery-based session identifies significant artists and writers of the 18th and 19th centuries, in particular William Blake, whose *Songs of Innocence and Experience* form such a critical component of their A Level examination. The session aims to widen the students' knowledge and understanding of Romanticism, the inspiration from the natural world, and the influences of social and political change.

For the second part of the day, the Fitzwilliam Museum has generously allowed us access to their study rooms, where the students will have the unique opportunity to view their Blake manuscripts. These manuscripts are usually kept in the museum's archives and are not generally put on public display; therefore, this is an invaluable opportunity for students to view Blake's original work first-hand.
