



Summer Tasks 2024

Summer Task Title / Instructions:

1. Speaking : Prepare a 3-5 minute oral presentation (in Spanish) – you can do this with visual aids/on PowerPoint /using images. The topic must be **either** : Las fiestas - A Hispanic festival you have researched **or** La música – Music (or dance) in a Spanish-speaking country.

2. Writing : Film Review in Spanish - Watch a Spanish film (or more than one!) with English subtitles. Some suggestions are listed below, but you may choose any film.

Write a short summary of the storyline in Spanish. Describe the setting / scenery, comment on the actors, describe particular scenes or incidents (good or bad) and give your own opinions.

Suggested films :-

Volver (2006, Pedro Almodóvar)

Mar Adentro (2004, Alejandro Amenábar)

El laberinto del fauno (2006, Guillermo del Toro)

Mujeres abordo de un ataque de nervios (1988, Pedro Almodóvar)

La lengua de las mariposas (1999, José Luis Cuerda)

...or any Spanish film of your choice.

3. Grammar booklet Read and complete exercises **1a, 1b, 2, 3, 19a, 19b, and 19c** as a minimum.

Additional practice (optional, but recommended):

Use a range of websites to keep on top of your Spanish revision and use any opportunity you have to read in Spanish or watch Spanish films and TV programmes.
